

Understand Achievement

- Present Level of Achievement
- Present Level Functional Performance

Family Engagement Prompt (New)

How will school staff engage parent(s)/families in the education of the student (e.g. sharing resources, communicating with parent(s)/families, building upon family strengths, connecting parent(s)/families to learning activities, etc.)?

Families can help school staff identify how they will engage families by sharing what they need or want to know.

Measurable Annual Goal

Develop Annual goals with the IEP Team. Check out Center for Parent Information & Resources Example Goal language

Progress Reporting

Parent/Families can track your child's progress toward IEP goals throughout the year to stay informed.



Align Services

Special Education Services

With the IEP team, determine what accommodations and supports your child will need to access the curriculum and make progress toward their IEP goals.

- If this is your first IEP meeting, talk with others who understand the IEP process
- Review the <u>IEP Checklist</u>
- Student Snapshot/My Snapshot
- Talk with your child
- Review the present IEP
- Write down a list of questions that you want to ask at the meeting
- Have positive conversations with your child's teacher(s) before the IEP meeting
