


Overview of Serving on Groups


- Developed due to an identified need

Helpful Tools to Reach Goals


- Action Plan

- Strategy Charts






Logic Model Example

5. Evaluation

- New information is compared to previously collected information
- Helpful Types of Evaluation



6. Process for Reaching Agreement

Voting

- Robert's Rules of Order
 - A structured process
 - Making and Passing Motions



Consensus

- Discussion continues until all mutually agree
- Every member shares
- Key is compromise



Tips to Help YOU Personally be Effective

- Organize your information
- Keep in mind the group's goals
- List priorities
- Keep track of where others stand on decisions
- Ask the leader to explain member roles
- Take notes
- Write down the results of your activities
