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What is a Reevaluation?

NOTICE OF REEVALUATION Form RE-1 (Rev. 87/2004)

Wies

- Evaluation to see if a child continues to be eligible for special education
- IEP Team (Parents!)
- Notice (<u>RE-1</u>)
- Reeval. required:
- Parent or Teacher 1. Request
- 2.
- Every 3 years 🚅 3.

Before removal


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3-Year Reevaluations

- Law requires a Reevaluation every 3 years
- IEP Team decides if child is still eligible: 1. Disability +
 - 2. Needs
- Notice of Reeval. sent to parents (RE-1)

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Special Education Removals

When child no longer needs special education

- A reevaluation is <u>required</u> before removal
 School/Parent can make the request to remove,
 - OR,
 - Removal can result from a 3-year reevaluation review
- IEP Team writes the report

School <u>must</u> notify parent in writing (<u>ER-4</u>)



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Requests for Reevaluation

- Parent or teacher may request any time (1/year)
- Parent & school must agree if over 1/year (<u>RE-2</u>)
- Possible reasons:
 - Not originally found eligible & still struggling
 - New areas of concern
 - Different or additional disability
 - Going to college soon





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What is an IEE?

- Evaluation by qualified examiner who is not employed by the school
- Public expense under certain conditions
- Or, parents' expense
- WI Info Bulletin <u>99.02</u>



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When to Ask for an IEE?

- When parent disagrees with IEP team's evaluation of their child, as:
 - Who did it (qualifications)
 - How it was done (assessment tools, methods, only 1 test)
 - Results of evaluation
 - IEP content resulting from evaluation
- Only <u>one</u> IEE for each evaluation the school does



How Does an IEE Work?

- <u>After</u> eval/reeval done
- Request in writing
- School response:
 - Provide IEE at public expense
 - OR, request Due Process Hearing
- Parent picks examiner
 - Check school criteria first
 - Unique circumstances
- School considers results
- Sends parents notice of IEP Team decision





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Private IEEs

- Private IEE anytime
- Parents can share private IEE with school
- School must consider the private IEE results
- School not have to pay for private IEE



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
